An aquatic center for today and tomorrow

Inaugurated in 1967, Cowansville's Aquatic Centre has served the community for 58 years, but its current state calls for a rethink of its future. Wear and tear on the structure and mechanical and electrical systems make renovation costly and ill-suited to current and future needs.

By 2021, the City had secured a grant covering 66.66% (\$5.18 million) of the estimated \$7.77 renovation project. The global pandemic and resulting delays pushed up the cost of the project in 2023. Financial assistance was increased to \$6.7 million, but the building's condition proved more critical than anticipated.

Following an exhaustive assessment, the work required to renovate the building is now estimated at between \$20 and \$22 million. However, these works, limited by the existing structure, would result in restricted and non-functional spaces to meet the current and future needs of the population served.

A firm will be commissioned to assess the needs of the population and to design a modern facility,

sustainable and accessible. The City is in the process of acquiring a 31-acre site on Mercier Street near Massey-Vanier, offering an ideal location and opportunities to integrate trails and green areas.

Next steps

- Needs analysis and opportunity .
- Search for financing.
- Modification of grants from government departments.
- Finalization land acquisition.
- Design and construction tenders.



Bulky goods collection by appointment

All new! In addition to the bulky goods collection on July 7, we've added 5 registration-only collections to the calendar. This will give you greater flexibility, while optimizing the collection process for our teams.



You can plan your registration according to the scheduled dates, but bulky items must be dropped off no more than 24 hours in advance.

As indicated in the 2025 collection calendar, registration is required for the July 7 collection. other dates added to the calendar, you must register at cowansville.ca/collections.

Here are the upcoming dates:

- February 10: collection already completed with 42 registrations
- April 7: registration before March 31
- June 9: registration before June 2
- September 15: registration before September 8
- November 24: registration before November 17

The ecocenter remains a free, year-round service that's ideal for disposing of bulky items or materials that are refused during collection, such as construction waste.

If an item fits in your vehicle, it's not bulky and must be taken directly to the ecocenter. In the case of bulky items, if you are unable to check your item off the list on the registration form, it is not accepted for collection.

The list of accepted and refused materials, as well as registration details, are available on the website at cowansville.ca/collections.

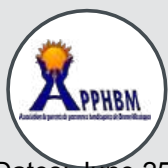

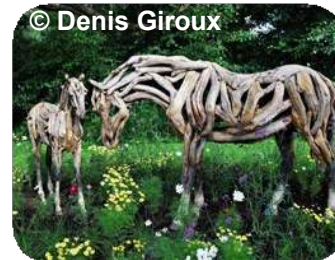
